101 Ranch Old Timers Assoc.	Applicant to receive \$1000 to improve the security and display of historical documents and photographs related to the 101 Ranch and its Wild West Shows.
American Choral Directors Association Archives for International Choral Music	Applicant to receive \$750 to migrate to digital format historic audio recordings from ACDA Southwest Conventions held in Oklahoma.
Anadarko Heritage Museum	Applicant to receive \$2,000 to purchase scanner, security cabinet, and supplies to digitize and securely store 350 historically important photographs by noted pioneer photographer Annete Ross Hume. Additional funds are to upgrade existing PastPerfect software to complete this project. Grant funds are NOT to be used for photocopying purposes.
Archives & Special Collections , Dulaney-Browne Library	Applicant to receive \$1505 for purchase of archival housing for oversized materials and equipment needed to implement an environmental monitoring program.
Bacone College	Applicant to receive \$1650 to improve security and appropriate display of Alexander Posey's collection of 93 rare books, c. 1850-1905.
Caddo Heritage Museum	Applicant to receive \$1000 for purchase of metal shelving and file cabinets for storage of archeological and repatriation records, as specified in the application.
Carl Albert State College, Joe E. White Library	Applicant to receive \$1015 for purchase of archival supplies to provide appropriate preservation and increased accessibility to materials from three areas of historical significance related to former U.S. Speaker of the House, Carol Albert, Dr. Joe E. White, and Carl Albert State College.
Cherokee Strip Regional Heritage Center, Inc.	Applicant to receive \$1560 to digitize images from its 10,000-piece collection of materials related to northwest Oklahoma. A minimum of 1,000 images will be digitized during the project period.
Five Civilized Tribes Museum	Applicant to receive \$3100 to implement an integrated pest management program to improve conditions in which historic materials related to Oklahoma tribes are stored. Funds include environmental monitoring equipment, air duct cleaning, and IPM supplies and materials.
Grady County Museum	Applicant to receive \$1000 to purchase archival supplies to provide appropriate storage and access to historic collections related to Grady County, including newspapers, genealogy and community history records, Grady County schools, civic club materials, and a collection of photographs from Chickasha, Indian Territory.
Hennessey Public Library	Applicant to receive \$4604 to purchase archival storage cabinets for the library's collection of materials related to the regional history of the Hennessey/Lacy/Dover area, including oral history recordings, photographs, family history files, Land Patents, newspapers, and other historic materials.

James J. Kelly Library, St. Gregory's University	Applicant to receive \$1567 for the purchase of UV filters, environmental filters, pest monitoring kit, and de-humidifier, as recommended in a Preservation Site Survey by Amigos Library Services. Collection includes materials dating from the 16 th century to the present, including a collection of rare and historic bibles in a variety of American Indian languages.
Kiowa County Museum	Applicant to receive \$438 for archival supplies to appropriately preserve 10 scrapbooks containing historic primary and secondary sources related to Kiowa County.
McCloud Historical Society	Applicant to receive \$1000 to purchase fireproof safe and archival supplies to preserve its unique and historic collections of original photographs, newspapers, negatives, and other historical documents related to the history of McCloud.
Oklahoma City Memorial	Applicant to receive \$1700 to purchase the RAID Network Storage device to safely store and retrieve 4,750 historical images related to the unique collections that document the April 19, 1995 Murrah Building bombing and subsequent rescue and recovery efforts.
Oklahoma Museums Assoc.	Applicant to receive \$1,000 to purchase archival products and a printer for the preservation of unique photographs and records related to Oklahoma public art.
Oklahoma Panhandle State University	Applicant to receive \$3000 for archival supplies for historically significant materials including photographs, drawings, newspapers, and minutes spanning the 100-year history of the University.
Oklahoma State Firefighters Museum	Applicant to receive \$1000 to purchase archival storage supplies and appropriate storage cabinet for historic and unique photographs depicting the history of firefighters in Oklahoma.
Oklahoma State University Institute of Tehhnology-Okmulgee	Applicant to receive \$3500 for the purchase of archival storage materials to house historic photographs, c. 1800-present, and furnishings consisting of flat files, a visible light meter, and UV light filters.
Oklahoma Zoological Society	Applicant to receive funding of \$2710 to digitally image a collection of 5,000 slides and negatives that depict the history of the Zoo.
Oral Roberts University	Applicant to receive \$1120 to provide humidty control to the Archives area for the perservation of historic documents and materials related to founder Oral Roberts and the history of the University.
Quapaw Tribal Library	Applicant to receive \$2525 to digitally preserve and archive historical photographs and documents related to the Quapaw Tribe, c. 1800-present.
Seminole Nation Museum	Applicant to receive \$4650 to improve the environmental controls of the facility to preserve photographs, sound recordings, video, film, slides, legal documents , scholarly disserations, newspapers, and manuscripts related to Seminole tribal culture and history.

Sherwin Miller Museum of Jewish Art	Applicant to receive \$1606 to provide archivally secure housing for the Livingston Oklahoma Jewish Archive, including appropriate boxes to ease crowding in existing storage and acid free encasements for photographs, documents, and ephemera in the archive. Collection represents a broad range of materials from Jewish communities statewide, with the earliest documents recording the first Jewish settlers of Indian Territory in 1865.
Southern Nazarene University Library	Applicant to receive \$1,000 for archival storage materials for the preservation of historic records related to the City of Bethany and the University. Project will improve accessibility to records as SNU prepares for its 100 th Homecoming Celebration and Bethany's Centennial Year in November 2009.
Standing Bear Native American Foundation	Applicant to receive \$1,000 to migrate 60 reel-to-reel tapes to digital format. Tapes contain significant tribal oral histories, pow wow recordings, and historical information related to the Ponca tribe. Tapes are showing signs of rapid deterioration and loss of audio integrity.
Thomas Wilhite Memorial Museum, Perkins	Applicant to receive \$900 for archival boxes to appropriately and securely store microfilm collection of materials related to the Perkins area. The Oklahoma Historical Society will gift a microfilm case and microfilm reader.
Wilson Historical Society and Museum	Applicant to receive \$2100 to digitize and catalog 590 images related to the history of Carter County and the communities of Wilson, Cornish, Dillard, Oil City, Orr, Rexroat, Simon, Wheeler, and Zaneis.
